

Course Descriptions for Summer 2008

ED 212 **Foundations in Education** (2)

The aim of this course is to train teachers, pastors and parents to develop awareness as to what makes education Christian. The student will develop a biblical foundation for education and his/her own philosophy of education. Other topics include: Christ, the Master Teacher; the place of the Holy Spirit; the teachers' role; and Sunday school.

MM 352 **Music Theory IV** (2)*

Advanced modulation, complex altered chords, 21st century techniques, ear training, part writing, keyboard harmony and experience in original composition are covered in this course.

Prerequisite: Music Theory III

NT 120 **New Testament Survey** (2)

In this course, each book of the New Testament is studied in terms of its author, audience, date and major themes. This is a good introductory course for students new to New Testament study.

OT 130 **Hebrew History: Wanderings** (2)

Beginning with the book of Exodus and concluding with the book of Ruth, this challenging course covers the development of the nation of Israel. Topics covered will include: the miraculous deliverance from Egypt, the Ten Commandments, the wandering in the wilderness, the triumph of the Canaan conquest and the dark ages of the judges. The course will close on the precipice of the emergence of Israel's monarchy.

OT 332 **Biblical Literature: Minor Prophets** (2)

This course consists of a study of the prophetic office, the man, his message and methods and leads into a consecutive review of each of the twelve Old Testament prophetic books between Hosea and Malachi. The underlying divine purposes will be noted, as well as the Messianic inferences and relevance of the message to the 21st century Christian.

PT 110 **How to Study the Bible (Hermeneutics)** (2)

This course covers the art of biblical interpretation. Topics covered include: the origin of the Bible, the inspiration of Scripture and the authority of Scripture. The student will develop in-depth study tools and skills to help "rightly divide the Word of truth."

SC 231 **Body by Design** (2)

This course will examine the anatomical evidences for creation in the human body. We will examine the human anatomy and physiology to see the purposeful, intricate design and function.

SS 151 **History of Christian Fine Arts** (2)*

This course is a general survey of the history of music, fine arts and drama in the Christian church as it grew and developed through the centuries until the present time. Recent history will include radio, film and television.

TH 220B **Bible Doctrine IB** (2)

This course is a general survey of the Doctrine of Christ (Christology): His Life, Birth, Death, Resurrection and Ascension. This pivotal course will lead the student to a deeper commitment to the Person and Power of the Lord. The combination of this course with TH 220A is equivalent to the 4-unit TH 220.

TH 230A **Bible Doctrine IIA** (2)

This course surveys the Doctrine of the Holy Spirit (Pneumatology) and the Doctrine of Angels (Angelology). The combination of this course with TH230B is equivalent to the 4 unit TH 230.
